At the upcoming Regional Planning Commission Meeting, we will hear a presentation from CTDOT on recent statistics, initiatives and planning activities for the CT*fastrak* bus rapid transit line. Much has taken place since the opening of CTfastrak on March 28, 2015. On August 30, 2016, Governor Malloy announced that CT*fastrak* had passed a milestone in having served over 4 million riders.

Given the success of the current system, CTDOT has also recently begun planning for expansion. In the last month, meetings have taken place in several locations east of Hartford to gain public input on expanding CT*fastrak* service to the east.

In the last several months, CRCOG has assisted CTDOT in engaging the communities along CT*fastrak* on the CTDOT TOD Capacity Study. This work builds upon the Market Analysis for Transit Oriented Development conducted by CRCOG as a part of the Sustainable Knowledge Corridor Project which concluded in 2013. The CTDOT study aims to do a deeper analysis of the parcels of land around each station on the CT*fastrak* line, to gauge each community's desire and readiness to do transit-oriented development, to determine the capacity of each community to do transit-oriented development and ultimately to outline a plan tailored to each community's needs.

CTDOT will address the RPC at its November 17th meeting and will provide an update that touches on the existing CT*fastrak* service, information on the current public process taking place around future expansion as well as other topics related to the bus rapid transit line.
