Weekly Legislative Feature Issues:

The 2017 Legislative Session Kick-Off

Although the 2017 Legislative Session officially convened last week on Wednesday, January 4, 2017, the business of the legislature really began to ramp up this week with the beginning of organizational committee meetings. This last week saw legislative committee assignments being released later than usual, which caused delay as legislative staff scrambled to move and reorganize offices.

Additionally, individual legislator's proposed bills have begun to be published and are available for review. In the coming weeks, these committees will screen and file committee bills. The volume will intensify before the committee bill deadlines. Governor Malloy is expected to release his proposed budget on Wednesday, February 8, 2017 for the upcoming 2018-2019 biennium with projected deficits of \$1.5 billion dollars for the next fiscal year (2017-2018) and \$1.6 billion for the 2018-2019 fiscal year.

This past week also revealed several budget-related themes of particular interest to you:

Governor Malloy remarked in his State of the State address last Wednesday, January 4, 2017:

"The state provides a total of \$5.1 billion in municipal assistance. That's more than one fifth of our overall budget this year, making it our biggest single expense – not state employee pensions, not Medicaid, not debt service, not salary and benefits of our employees; town aid accounts for the largest portion of our state budget," he said. "It simply would not be fair for us to talk about continued state agency reductions, or talk about the need for labor concessions, without talking about new ways to provide town aid."

Yesterday, while addressing the Connecticut Council of Small Towns at the organization's annual meeting, Governor Malloy offered no assurances that municipalities "would be spared from cuts to local aid" as state lawmakers grapple with another major deficit.

However, Governor Malloy did send a positive signal regarding state mandates on cities and towns in reply to Mayor Daniel Champagne's request for mandate relief.

“Give us some relief,” the Mayor [Champagne] said. “Get rid of some of these mandates. ...If you can get rid of some of these mandates, we can save money.”

Malloy replied that “you will be happy with the budget” he will propose to legislators next month.

Also yesterday, the Senate announced that it scheduled a vote on the Dec. 8 deal in order to level the pension payments to the State Employees Retirement System. The House is expected to schedule a vote as well.

House Minority Leader, Representative Themis Klarides explained that legislative approval of pension deals is important for fixing the retirement system, which is a contributor to the state’s fiscal crisis.

“We appreciate all the work that went into this proposal but it does not include critical issues such as pension benefits and individual contributions that must be addressed if the state is serious about fixing the retirement system,” Klarides has said. “These plans will grow increasingly unaffordable for future generations. Quite simply, our children and grandchildren will get stuck with the bills.”
