Sandra Bobowski stated she would like the committee to look into and discuss regional resource sharing. Karl Profe inquired about a CT*fastrak* update covering projections and calculations.

Mary Ellen Kowalewski introduced guest speakers, Lori J. Mathieu and Eric McPhee, with the Connecticut Department of Public Health.

4. Report on Zoning and Subdivision Referrals

Emily Hultquist presented this item to the committee. She discussed the supplemental report, highlighting the towns of Avon and East Windsor's proposed plan of conservation and development updates.

Lamont Aheart moved to approve the referrals. Stanley Sobieski seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

5. <u>What's New in My Town-A Discussion and Report on Local Planning and</u> <u>Development Activities in the Municipalities of the Capitol Region</u>

Hartford- Sandra Bobowski updated the committee on the status of the stadium.Stadium work may resume as early as next week.



Manchester-Timothy Bergin updated the committee on residential apartment houses. The town will allow apartment houses to go to 7 stories in the general business zone. This amendment will allow the first project above 30 feet.

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Mansfield-Susan Westa updated the committee on multi-family housing regulations. There will be a 9 month moratorium until regulations are received.

Simsbury-William Rice updated the committee on their plan update process – the town just hired a consultant to begin the update. A draft will be submitted to CRCOG in the coming year.

Mary Ellen Kowalewski advised the committee that RPC members and alternates appointments will be requested in the fall.

Emily Hultquist notified the committee of an invitation to apply for free technical assistance from EPA. The goal is to assist in overcoming barriers while implementing smart growth development approaches. The application deadline is 5pm on October 12, 2016.
