



Connecticut Work Zone Safety

Through a partnership between the Technology Transfer Center at UCONN and the CT Department of Transportation, we are very pleased to inform you that your town has been selected to receive a free work zone safety equipment package and work zone safety training for up to four (4) of your employees.

The goal of this new Work Zone Safety program is to help Connecticut’s cities & towns make their work zones safer for roadway workers, motorists and pedestrians. The package will provide necessary equipment so that communities can warn and guide traffic around and through road construction and maintenance zones.

Your package will be delivered directly to your town and include:

2 - 18” Pole Mounted Stop/Slow Paddles
16 – 28” Orange Traffic Cones with 4X6 reflective collars
8 - 36” Reflective Roll Up Signs – 2 each of the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Road Work Ahead • One Lane Road Ahead • Flagger Symbol • End Road Work
2 – Road Work Ahead – Fines Doubled Roll Up Signs
10 – Traffic Sign Stands
2 – Class III Safety Vests
2 – Hard Hats
2 – All weather Flagger Whistles
Training vouchers for a one day Work Zone Training (up to 4)

Lisa Knight, from the T2 Center, will be notifying the towns of the available dates for the work zone safety training and will be coordinating with you on the training participants. **Please Note: The training is required to receive your work zone safety equipment kit.**

Lisa will also notify you of the anticipated arrival date of your work zone equipment. All we ask if that when you unpack the package, please send us a photo of your crew with your new work zone equipment.
