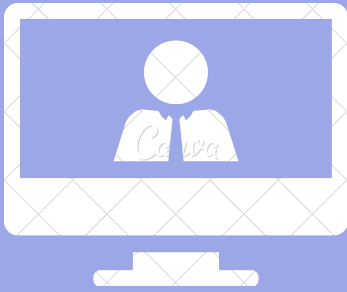

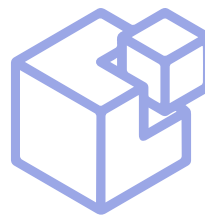

ORDER NOW FOR FALL CLINICS

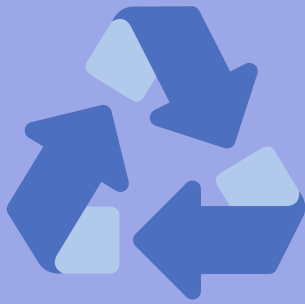

DEVELOPING UNIFORM REGIONAL GOALS

The DEMHS Region 3 Cyber Security met June 11th. Jeff Brown, the State's new Chief Information Security Officer was introduced and expressed interest in working with the regional task forces. The group discussed coordination with the State and CT Education Network mutual aid initiatives within the CT Cyber Security Committee. 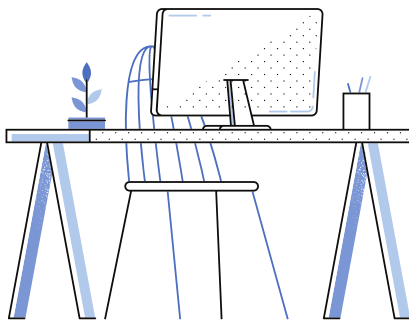


SOLID WASTE

AGREEMENT WITH CONTRACTOR TERMINATED

The MIRA board voted to terminate the agreement with Sacyr and Rooney (effective August 31) due to high costs and lack of funding sources. Three proposals to supplement income were presented to the state legislature, which is out of session due to Covid. If unresolved by end of August, MIRA will begin to design transfer stations for Hartford, Torrington, Essex and Waterford. Further discussion, including CRCOG reach out to the legislature/Governor, will be at the next CCSWA meeting June 16th.

COVID OFFICE CHANGES



EZIQC HELPS TRANSITION TO SAFE WORKSPACES

The reopening of municipal offices and public spaces has created a need for additional safety measures. **CRCOG's eziQC program** is available to help:

- Install hand-washing stations and no-touch technologies
- Remove and replace finishes with anti-microbial options
- Upgrade and modify HVAC for filtration
- Install physical barriers, such as plexiglass or walls
- Re-configure spaces for social distancing and reduce workplace density
- Sanitize and decontaminate spaces
- Make elevator modifications
