SUBJECT: U.S. EDA CARES Act Funding

The U.S. Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provides the Economic Development Administration (EDA) with \$1.5 billion for economic development assistance programs to help communities prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus. It provides a wide range of financial assistance to communities and regions as they respond to and recover from the impacts of the pandemic.

Unlike normal U.S. EDA funding, the CARES Act funding has two unique attributes. First, it is available to all communities, regardless of their level of "distress". All communities are considered to be impacted by the coronavirus and are thus eligible. Second, the EDA expects to fund 80% to 100% of project costs. Normally, they only fund 50% of project costs, except under special circumstances.

Examples of projects that may be funded through CARES Act Recovery Assistance include economic recovery planning and preparing technical strategies to address economic dislocations caused by the coronavirus pandemic, preparing or updating resiliency plans to respond to future pandemics, implementing entrepreneurial support programs to diversify economies, and constructing public works and facilities that will support economic recovery, including the deployment of broadband for purposes including supporting telehealth and remote learning for job skills.
