Subject: Resolution Authorizing Agreement with Yale New Haven Health Services Organization

Background: The Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps applied for funding through the State of Connecticut Health Care Coalition for the purpose of developing mission sets in collaboration with ESF-8 partners for long-term care bedside support and long-term care coordinating center support. A training curriculum will be developed for each mission set and training conducted. The application was approved, and funding will be provided to CRCOG through an Agreement with Yale New Haven Health Services Corporation, who is the fiduciary and administrative agent for the Health Care Coalition.

Benefit to Member Towns/CRCOG: This funding will serve to provide advanced training to the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps volunteers and aid in their operations. The training received by CR-MRC volunteers will be an asset to all CRCOG member communities.

Financial/Operational Impact: This award is for \$28,882.64 and CRCOG will receive \$3,000 for project administration.

Project Schedule: The grant funds will be made available upon Agreement signature and the project shall be completed by June 15, 2023.

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AGREEMENT WITH YALE NEW HAVEN
HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION**

WHEREAS, the Connecticut Department of Public Health provides federal Hospital Planning and Preparedness (HPP) funds to the State of Connecticut Health Care Coalition; and

WHEREAS, Yale New Haven Health Services Corporation is the fiduciary and administrative agent for the State of Connecticut Health Care Coalition; and

WHEREAS, the State of Connecticut Health Care Coalition invited proposals from Medical Reserve Corps units to conduct special projects for the purpose of training and building capacity; and

WHEREAS, the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps applied for funding for the purpose of developing mission sets for Long-term care bedside support and Long-term care coordinating center support; and

WHEREAS, a training curriculum will be developed for each mission set and training sessions conducted; and

WHEREAS, the approved budget includes a line item for Quality Perspectives as the lead trainer on this project; and

WHEREAS, the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps application was approved by the Health Care Coalition; and

WHEREAS, CRCOG will receive funds from Yale New Have Health Services Corporation in the amount of \$28,882.64 to administer this project for the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps by purchasing the equipment necessary to conduct the training and providing payment to the certified trainer; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that that the CRCOG Policy Board authorize the Executive Director to sign an agreement with Yale New Have Health Services Corporation and any addendums thereto and accept grant funds for the purposes outlined above in accordance with the project budget.
