

B. BIL/IIJA Update

- CRCOG staff submitted a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Application to update the Regional Transportation Safety Plan.
- CRCOG staff coordinated and assisted in the preparation of a multijurisdictional (5 town) SS4A Implementation Plan Grant Application.
- CRCOG staff collaborated with representatives of CTDOT and interested eligible applicants (City of Hartford) to support applications for an upcoming Reconnecting Communities grant opportunity.
- CRCOG staff prepared multiple memoranda for the Transportation Committee related to BIL/IIJA Programs.
- CRCOG staff presented an overview to the Municipal Services Committee meeting.

C. Municipal Services

- ClearGov has been selected for Budget Software RFP.
- Fire/EMS Records Management Systems (RMS) RFP and Auditing Services RFP were issued Sept. 12th.
- Sand, Asphalt Pavement Crack Sealing, Ladder and Hose Testing bids have been issued and will close on Sept. 20th and Sept. 22nd.
- CRPC will be collecting quantities for gasoline at the end of September – this is a NO PIGGYBACKING bid so be sure to submit quantities to Kim no later than Oct. 16th!
- Extended agreement and updated pricing with Sertex for IT Services Fiber contract.

D. Planning: Community Development

- CRCOG welcomed two new staff members to the Community Development Unit: Kyle Shiel as a Principal Planner and Jacob Knowlton as a Planner.
- CRCOG welcomed Anthony Diaz as an intern through UConn's Internship and Professional Practice (IPP) Program. Anthony will be working with CRCOG's Planning Department throughout the 2022-2023 school year.
- CRCOG staff and over 30 volunteers conducted the 9th Annual Bike/Ped Counts.
- Staff participated in the Sustainable CT Fall certification review cycle.
- The Regional Planning Commission meeting was held September 22nd.
- Year 4 of the State's Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) grant program ends September 29th and will carry into the 5th year of the program.

E. Planning: Transportation

- Transportation Committee approved the Selection Policy for the 2023 LOTCIP Project Solicitation. The solicitation is anticipated for release in November 2022.
- Staff updated the FY22-23 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) to reflect increased IIJA funding. This update was endorsed by the Transportation Committee and is before the Policy Board for approval.
- Staff continues to advance the following studies: Capitol Region Roundabout Screening; Routes 190 and 220 Traffic Impact Study, Enfield; Farmington Area Connectivity Study; TOD Roles, Visioning, Viability, and Tools Analysis.
- The following studies are in the initiation phase: East Coast Greenway Gap Closure Study; Route 20 Corridor Study, Windsor Locks; Route 44 Corridor Study, Canton.

- Staff updated the Transportation Committee on Traffic Incident Management (TIM) Responder Training Course, Bikeshare Feasibility Study Update: DRAFT Final Report, Transportation Rural Improvement Program (TRIP), and Municipal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Compliance Assessment.

F. Public Safety

- Work on the FY 19 SHSGP is well underway. All open grants include funds for training and exercise, contractual support and sustainment and maintenance of regional equipment. There are set asides for the Hartford Bomb Squad, Capitol Region HAZMAT team and Metropolitan Medical Response System.
- CRCOG is proud to host our first Regional CERT Basic Training Class. All teams in our region were given the opportunity to register members. The class began September 15th and will run for eight weeks.
- CRCOG's Region 3 Cyber Security Task Force held a Cyber Security tabletop exercise to gauge the preparedness of our communities.
- CRCOG staff continues to work with Tetra Tech on an After-Action Review of the region's response during the Covid pandemic. The final report will be presented in October.
- CRCOG staff will participate in an Active Threat Training session presented by the UConn Police Department.
