## 3. Approval of Minutes from October 26, 2022

- **5. Legislative Update** Ms. Lutz provided a brief Legislative update to the Committee. CGA website was down. Bills concerning FOI and PFAS are moving forward. Half of the

committees have reached their deadline – A waste management meeting was postponed due to lack incomplete notification. Lutz will be emailing further bill information once the CGA website is updated.

# 6. Waste Management Project Presentation by Jim Frey, RRS:

Jim Frey, President of Resource Recycling Services (RSS) presented an overview of the report prepared by RRS and TetraTech, with input from CRCOG's project committee and staff. Among other points, Mr. Frey reviewed waste disposal capacity within the region, and opportunities to promote diversion and recyclizing on a regional basis. # 7. Resolution to Support CRCOG's Role as Lead Organization for the EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant Program

Elizabeth Sanderson reviewed staff's memo and recommendation that the Policy Board approve the resolution demonstrating support for CRCOG's role as lead organization for the planning grant cooperative agreement. The grant will provide funding for staffing and hiring a consultant. Jon Colman made a motion to support CRCOG's role as Lead Organization for the EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Act, Eric Anderson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

# 8. Resolution Authorizing Execution of Contract Between CRCOG and Quality Perspectives for Training and Strategic Planning Services for the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps

Cheryl Assis reviewed the staff memo and noted that the resolution will serve to provide training and planning services to the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps volunteers and aid in their operations. The CR-MRC is an available asset to all CRCOG member communities. Jon Colman made a motion to support, and Eric Anderson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

#### 9 Action: TIP Amendments:

Jon Colman moved for approval of the 7 TIP Amendments. Bob Bessel seconded. Mr. Colman explained that the amendments have been reviewed and recommended by the transportation committee. Motion passed unanimously.

#### 10. Action: Resolution: Canton Route 44 Corridor Study

Jon Colman briefly outlined the scope of the proposed study focused on a sizable portion of Route 44 in the town of Canton and moved for approval. Bob Bessel seconded. Mr. Colman added that the Transportation Committee has endorsed the study. The motion passed unanimously.

# 11. Action: Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside – Confirmation of Priority Projects

Jon Colman reviewed the proposed priority projects and moved for approval. Bob Bessel seconded. Mr. Colman recommended confirmation of the project priority list as previously submitted, which the Transportation Committee endorsed at its March 20, 2023 meeting. The motion passed unanimously.

Matt Hart reviewed the attached correspondence consisting of letters of support for various grant funded projects and testimony in support of various bills. He explained that any testimony prepared by staff is designed to be consistent with CRCOG's adopted Legislative Agenda.

## 16. Adjournment

Jon Colman made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Eric Anderson seconded the motion, and the motion carried unanimously. Mayor Stewart called the meeting adjourned at 12:53 PM.
