**Subject:** 2023 LOTCIP Solicitation Staff Ratings and Draft Selections

A Cost Review Subcommittee meeting will be held on April 24 at 11 am. The Committee will review and discuss the 2023 LOTCIP solicitation draft rankings and to entertain subcommittee action for endorsement of project selections. Our project selection policy discussed reserving \$33.75 million for the solicitation, with the following funding splits:

Traditional Reconstruction Projects	\$15,000,000
Bridge/Culvert Improvement Projects	\$10,000,000
Pavement Rehab/Stand-Alone Sidewalk Projects	\$ 3,750,000
Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects	\$ 2,500,000
Rural Set Aside Projects	\$ 2,500,000

To attain the goal of funding approximately \$33.75 million of projects, staff recommends increasing the allocated \$15 million reserved for Traditional Reconstruction Projects to approximately \$20 million. This recommendation is due to CRCOG receiving project funding requests for Bridge/Culvert Improvement and Bike and Pedestrian Projects \$5.05 million less than allocated amount.

Attached to this memorandum, please find Table 1 showing staff project selection recommendations based on the highest rated projects within each funding category, and CRCOG's rural set-aside guidelines. The result is a \$36.3+ million of selections that staff recommends being approved for application processing and submission to CTDOT for inclusion in the LOTCIP program.

Of the selected projects, two (2) have been designated "incentive project" selections as identified in Table 1 by an asterisk \*. This designation of "incentive projects" is in keeping with CRCOG's historic practice of conditionally awarding high ranking projects to municipalities that already have multiple LOTCIP projects (for this solicitation staff proposes 3 or more) in the design phase. The advancement of these "incentive projects" would be contingent on that municipality completing the design of one of their three other LOTCIP projects. All other projects will be advanced to CTDOT as soon as possible.

Also, attached to this memorandum please find the draft project ratings for reconstruction projects (Table 2), pavement rehabilitation/stand-alone sidewalk projects (Table 3) and bicycle/pedestrian projects (Table 4). The draft project ratings for the reconstruction projects is delineated by a "heavy line", above which are the projects selected due to the revised funding allocation discussed above. All project submissions within the Bridge/Culvert, Pavement Rehabilitation/Stand Alone Sidewalk, and Bicycle and Pedestrian Project funding categories were selected, due to funding requests that were within (or approximating) reserved funding category amounts. In addition, per CRCOG selection policies, the top ranked "Rural project" from below the delineation line has been selected for funding.
