Transportation-Related Funding Opportunities

U.S. DOT Bridge Investment Program

Application Deadline: November 27, 2023, for use of FY 2023 and FY2024 Funds

The U.S. DOT FHWA is soliciting applications for Bridge Investment Program (BIP) **Large Bridge Project** grants. A Large Bridge
Project is a project with total eligible costs greater than \$100M. FHWA will solicit applications for Planning and



Bridge Project (a project with total eligible costs not greater than \$100M) grants at a later date.

Recall, that CRCOG has mapped State and local bridges throughout the region listed on the National Bridge Inventory that may be eligible for funding from this program. Maps were created using data from the <u>CT DOT Master Bridge List</u>, and are available to view on <u>CRCOG's BIL Webpage for the BIP</u>.

The maps can be used to guide decisions and plan investments, taking advantage of once-in-a-generation funding while it is available.

To apply for FY2023 and FY2024 funds, submit applications electronically through **Grants.gov** (Opportunity Number: 693JJ323NF00019) before the deadline.

Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis. The schedule for future funding rounds has been issued with this NOFO:

- For FY 2025 funds, applications are due by August 1, 2024.
- For FY 2026 funds, applications are due by August 1, 2025.

CT DOT Grant Solicitation for Phase 1 of the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Plan (NEVI)

Key deadline: Applicants must submit a **Letter of Intent by November 9**, **2023**



- * Program Purpose: Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) has approximately \$15M available to implement Phase 1 of the <u>State's National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Plan</u>, which focuses on building-out electric vehicle fast-charging stations in <u>priority areas across the state</u>.
- * Key Dates and Deadlines:
 - CTDOT anticipates opening the call for Letters of Intent (LOI) on September 28.
 - · Applicants must submit LOIs by 5 pm on November 9 2023.
 - CTDOT anticipates publishing the Request for Proposals (RFP) in early 2024.

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) is seeking proposals to implement Phase 1 of the State's National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) Plan. This first phase focuses on strategically deploying Direct Current Fast Charging (DCFC) electric chargers along designated Alternative Fuel Corridors (AFCs). The goal is to build-out the national electric AFC network. Up to \$15M is available for this first round of funding.

U.S. DOT FHWA Electric Vehicle Charger Reliability and Accessibility Accelerator Grant Program

Application deadline: November 13, 2023



- ★ Program Purpose: U.S. Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has up to \$100M available to improve reliability of existing electric vehicle infrastructure. Funds must be used to repair or replace existing publicly accessible Level 2 or Direct Current Fast Charging chargers that are broken or non-operational, per the National Renewable Energy Laboratory's list of Alternative Fuels Station Locator, as of October 11, 2023. FHWA anticipates funding all eligible projects.
- * Eligible Applicants include State DOTs and local governments.
- * Grant Applications are due by November 13; Apply online at <u>Grants.gov</u> (Opportunity Number: 693JJ324NF00001)

U.S. Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) is now accepting applications from State Departments of Transportation and Local Governments to repair or replace broken or inoperable electric vehicle charging stations across the country. To be eligible for funding, EV charging ports must be publicly accessible Level 2 or Direct Current Fast Charging (DCFC) chargers identified as "temporarily unavailable" on the <u>Alternative Fuel Station Locator map</u>.

Up to \$100M is available. The total application is not to exceed five pages, and FHWA anticipates awarding all eligible applications. Applicants are encouraged to submit applications that include multiple locations.



A reminder that applications for U.S. DOT for Stage 1 Planning and Prototyping Grants for the SMART Program are **due next Tuesday, October 10**.

Up to \$50M is available for Stage 1 demonstration projects focused on innovative solutions that make transportation systems safer and more efficient.

SMART projects must involve at least one of the following eight technology areas:

U.S. DOT THRIVING COMMUNITIES PROGRAM

- * Program Purpose: A Technical assistance and Capacity Building program to support disadvantaged, rural, and Tribal communities with navigating the federal funding process. Up to \$22M is available to support national or regional organizations with becoming Capacity Builders. Communities interested in receiving support from selected Capacity Builders must submit a Letter of Interest by November 15, 2023.

The **Thriving Communities Program (TCP)** is a technical assistance and capacity building program to support disadvantaged, rural, and tribal communities. Communities that have been adversely or disproportionately affected by environmental, climate, and human health policy outcomes will be offered the opportunity to apply for funding to receive technical tools and organizational capacity to compete for federal aid and deliver quality infrastructure projects.

Capacity Builder Teams will provide "deep-dive technical assistance, planning, and capacity building support to under-resourced and disadvantaged communities across the U.S. to help ensure these communities have the technical tools and organizational capacity to comprehensively plan for and deliver quality infrastructure projects and community development projects that enable their communities and neighborhoods to thrive" (U.S. DOT Thriving Communities Program Website).

U.S. DOT expects to award \$22M through a total of nine awards with up to five awards for each of the two different types of cooperative agreements:

- 1. TCP-National Capacity Builder (TCP-N), with award amounts projected to be \$4-5 million each.
- 2. TCP-Regional Capacity Builder (TCP-R), with awards amounts projected to be \$1-2 million each.

There is no cost share or matching required. USDOT will enter into a cooperative agreement with successful applicants, and will fund up to 100% of eligible costs through a monthly reimbursement model.

Submit grant applications via **Grants.gov** before the application deadline.



CTDEEP Urban and Community Forestry Planning Grant Program

The Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CTDEEP) recognizes the important role that trees and forests play in filtering our air and water, maintaining biodiversity, reducing air temperatures, and many other health and environmental benefits. The Urban and Community Forestry Planning Grant Program makes \$150,000 available to CT municipalities and non-profit 501(c)3 organizations to assess, inventory, study, monitor, manage, and plan urban and community trees and forests.

Climate Pollution Reduction Grants Program (CPRGP)

Application Deadline: April 1, 2024

The Environmental Protection Agency has opened the implementation phase of the Climate Pollution Reduction Grants Program.

This second phase closely follows the first phase of the program, which focuses on developing Climate Action Plans. Up to \$4.6 billion is available

to fund measures in applicable Priority Climate Action Plans.

Over the past few months, CRCOG has been collaborating with the State Department of Energy and Environmental Protection (CTDEEP) and other COGs and stakeholders in Connecticut.

CRCOG is seeking a consultant to assist in preparing a Regional Climate Action Plan to take full advantage of this funding opportunity. Per the Addendum, proposals will be accepted until **noon on Wednesday**, October 11, 2023.



U.S. DOE Carbon Utilization Procurement Grants (UPGrants)

Application deadline: April 30, 2024

The Department of Energy (DOE) is investing \$100M over fiscal years 2023 through 2026 for **UPGrants**. UPGrants are demonstration grants that will allow states, local governments, and public utility or agency entities to procure and



use commercial or industrial products that are derived from anthropogenic carbon oxides, which are carbon dioxide and carbon monoxide emissions concentrated through human activity. Through innovation we can support a transition to clean energy, curb climate crisis, and significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

Applicants must submit Concept Papers in advance of submitting Full Applications. Visit the **DOE's Program Webpage** for more information.

Brownfield Funding!

The CRCOG region is full of former manufacturing sites that are now brownfields – sites with environmental contamination that can be expensive to remediate. CRCOG was awarded a grant for assessment of these brownfield sites in 2009, and in 2014, we were awarded an EPA grant for a Revolving Loan Fund (RLF). This November, we will be applying to EPA again for Multipurpose, Assessment and Cleanup funding, which will help potential developers identify the contaminants and develop a plan to get them cleaned up.



In addition, CRCOG's RLF can provide funds to help public, non-profit and private developers clean up contaminated sites for redevelopment. The MetroHartford CRCOG Brownfields program can be flexible with terms & conditions, and as payments are made on the loan, those funds can be given to municipalities as a sub-

grant, allowing all the development dollars to go further, while providing benefits to residents in terms of improved health and quality of life.
