Capitol Region East Coast Greenway Study

- Preferred alignment identified in East Hartford
- Preferred alignment formally endorsed by Simsbury Board of Selectmen in September
- Simsbury Study currently open for Public Comment
- Progressing Bloomfield and Hartford shortlist options
- Focus on feasibility study along the Griffin Line rail corridor for rail-WITH-trail
- Griffin task expected to wrap early 2024



Walk Audit Program – Overview and Discussion

Statewide Bike/Ped Resident Survey

•Bike Walk Connecticut (BWCT) and the Capital Regional Council of Governments (CRCOG) partnered to complete a survey of Connecticut residents to understand their experience and priorities as pedestrians and bicyclists.

•The survey was promoted online and through social media and was open from June through September 2023.

•In parallel, a municipal survey explored the status of bicycle and pedestrian planning and policies.


•The work was part of our CDC funded "Active CT" project

Statewide Bike/Ped Resident Survey – The Pedestrian Experience

Slightly more than **50%** are "somewhat uncomfortable" or "uncomfortable" as a pedestrian, with **18%** in the uncomfortable category.

More than 55% of respondents responded that getting places by foot was not generally possible. 495 respondents provided commentary on this question, with many references to sidewalk needs, among other concerns.


Statewide Bike/Ped Resident Survey – The Pedestrian Experience



Sidewalks and Walking Paths-% of respondents selecting


Statewide Bike/Ped Resident Survey – The Pedestrian Experience

- Survey respondents were very generous with commentary on most questions, including significant detail that could be useful to planners and town officials.
- 585 respondents offered additional comments about the survey topic, some of which was reinforcing of earlier comments and concerns.
- 663 respondents offered comments regarding good streets or intersections for pedestrians
- 727 respondents offered commentary on bad streets or intersections for pedestrians




