1. Call to Order

Erin Stewart called meeting to order at 12:03 PM

2. Public Comment

5. Legislative Update

During Matt Hart's recent visit to Washington D.C., Matt met with congressmen and expressed gratitude for the received funds while emphasizing the importance of continued infrastructure funding. Chris Smith noted that the CRCOG region represents about 20% of the state and highlighted strong support for CRCOG's priorities. The appropriations budget hearings have concluded, with ongoing public hearings and

upcoming voting on bills next week. Currently, the we are awaiting the legislature to propose their budget, with key budget items such as fiscal guardrails being considered. Additionally, Matt mentioned that he regularly submits testimony on behalf of the organization.

6. Presentations

Begins at one minute in. Congressman Courtney acknowledged the hard work and dedication of all the Connecticut Councils of Governments (COGS), emphasizing their importance and recognition within the government sector. The Congressman commended the COGS for their valuable contributions and partnership in working towards common goals for the benefit of the community, especially in terms of rural health care. Additionally, the congressman discussed federal funding timelines, workforce development, workforce board, job training and answered questions from the board.

7. <u>Resolution Authorizing Submittal of the DEEP Recreational Trail Grant and to Provide Match from the CRCOG Regional Fund</u>

Pauline Yoder presented the resolution. The towns of Andover, Coventry, Ellington, Glastonbury, Hartford, Newington, Rocky Hill, South Windsor, Vernon, and Wethersfield have shown interest in collaborating to apply for the DEEP Recreational Trail Grant aimed at acquiring maintenance equipment for trails. 8. Resolution Authorizing Agreement with the National Association of City and County Health Officials (NACCHO)

Cheryl Assis presented, that CRCOG has received Operational Readiness Awards from NACCHO over the years to sustain, train, and equip the Capitol Region Medical Reserve Corps (CRMRC). This award will include funds for the CR-MRC Logistics Unit Leader and Trainer to facilitate a mission ready logistics support team. Jon Colman made a motion to approve, and Lori Spielman seconded. Motion passed.

9. <u>Resolution Endorsing the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) for the</u> Hartford-East Hartford-Middletown MSA

Kyle Shiel recommended the Board's approval of the Priority Climate Action Plan and welcomed any feedback the members may have. Jon Colman made a motion to approve, and Lisa Thomas seconded. Motion passed.
