**Subject:** 2024 LOTCIP Solicitation – Recommended Project Selections

**Background:** A Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued in October 2023 requesting municipal transportation projects that would compete for approximately \$42 million of Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTCIP) funding.

**Benefit to Member Towns/CRCOG:** Under LOTCIP, municipalities receive 100% construction funding for a variety of transportation projects. The program is more streamlined compared to federal transportation funding opportunities.

<u>Financial/Operational Impact:</u> LOTCIP is a state-funded program for municipal transportation projects. LOTCIP funds construction costs at 100%, however municipalities are responsible for all Design phase related costs. LOTCIP provides CRCOG with program administration funding as requested.

<u>Project Schedule:</u> Once projects are approved, they will be reviewed by CRCOG staff and consultants in Summer/Fall 2024 for additional data as needed. Applications will be submitted to CTDOT during the Fall/Winter 2024/2025 for issuance of Commitment to Fund Letters during Winter/Spring 2025.

**Recommendation:** CRCOG staff recommends approval of nineteen (19) project selections in the amount of \$39,663,800 from the LOTCIP 2024 Solicitation. This recommendation was endorsed by the Transportation Committee at its meeting on April 22, 2024.

A Transportation Committee meeting will be held on April 22, 2024 at 12 noon. The Committee will review and discuss the 2024 LOTCIP solicitation draft rankings and entertain endorsement of the project selections. Our project selection policy discussed reserving \$42million for the solicitation, with the following funding splits:

Traditional Reconstruction Projects	\$ 29,000,000
Pavement Rehab/Stand-Alone Sidewalk Projects	\$ 6,300,000
Bicycle/Pedestrian Projects	\$ 2,500,000
Rural Set Aside Projects	\$ 4,200,000

To attain the goal of funding approximately \$42 million of projects, staff recommends selecting all projects that were submitted, totalling approximately \$39.6+ million. As a result, the \$29 milion reserved for Traditional Reconstruction Projects would increase by \$5+ million to approximately \$34.4 million, which is more than offset by the \$7.7 million less needed to fully fund projects submitted for the three other categories collectively.

Attached to this memorandum, please find Table 1 showing staff project selection recommendations based on the highest rated projects within each funding category. The result is \$39.6+ million of selections that staff recommends being approved for application processing and submission to CTDOT for inclusion in the LOTCIP program.

Also, attached to this memorandum please find the draft project ratings for reconstruction projects (Table 2), pavement rehabilitation/stand-alone sidewalk projects (Table 3) and bicycle/pedestrian project (Table 4).
