Subject: TIP Amendments

Background: Each Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is required to maintain a four-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), detailing all federal surface transportation funding. As part of maintaining this document, the MPO approves amendments as needed.

b. Project Narrative

The application must include information required for FHWA to determine that the project satisfies requirements described in Sections A, B, and C and to assess the selection criteria specified in Section E (see project narrative requirements below). Applicants should provide data and evidence in a form that is verifiable or publicly available. The FHWA recommends that the project narrative adhere to the following basic outline of a project description, staffing description, and funding description to clearly address the program requirements and make critical information readily apparent.

Narrative requirements:

 Project description, including location of charger to be repaired or replaced, project cost, evidence of charger being able to be operational within the 12-month period of grant agreement, and plan for ongoing ownership/stewardship.

EVgo seeks to remove and replace the existing 50kW electric vehicle charger located at 471 New Park Ave, West Hartford, CT 06110 with U.S. manufactured Delta Electronics 350kW HP dual port chargers for a project cost estimate of \$856,000. This project cost also includes the Capitol Region Council of Government's administration of the grant. These chargers are rated to simultaneously charge two vehicles up to 175kW each, or one vehicle up to 350kW. The existing first generation 50kW charger is incapable of providing a reliable user experience, as demonstrated through a PlugScore of 2.5 out of a possible 10 on PlugShare. This is further indicated by 41% of recent PlugShare check-ins demonstrating an unsuccessful charge. This charger model requires a full replacement to return to reliable operational state because the hardware experiences an excessively high failure rate and frequently requires repair. Even when the charger is functional, PlugShare customer reviews and EVgo's data indicate that drivers often struggle to successfully charge in part because the unit only supports up to 500V DC.

The replacement chargers will bring this site into compliance with 23 CFR part 680, comply with Build America, Buy America ("BABA") requirements and provide a significantly improved customer experience. EVgo has aligned capital resources and construction team availability to ensure timely completion and commissioning within the proposed 12-month grant agreement. EVgo will continue to own and operate the upgraded electric vehicle charging station located at 471 New Park Ave, West Hartford, CT 06110 throughout the five-year period of commitment and beyond.

• Description of repair or replacement being made.

EVgo will remove and replace the existing 50kW electric vehicle charger located at 471 New Park Ave, West Hartford, CT 06110 with U.S. manufactured Delta Electronics 350kW HP dual port chargers. When completed, the site will host four ports capable of charging four vehicles simultaneously at 175kW in line with NEVI corridor minimums that apply to this location. In addition, EVgo will perform all additional work necessary to bring this site into compliance with NEVI minimum standards and requirements referenced in 23 CFR Part 680.

• Description of how the project will meet minimum standards and requirements (23 CFR Part 680).

EVgo will meet the minimum standards and requirements referenced in 23 CFR Part 680. With respect to charger capacity, EVgo will install two Delta Electronics 350kW HP dual port chargers. These chargers are BABA compliant, publicly available 24/7, and feature dual port dynamic power sharing, meaning one car can receive up to 350kW, or two cars charging simultaneously can each receive 175kW. Transparent pricing will be displayed on the charger with NEVI-compliant payment options.

Description of how the eligible entity will ensure that approvals and requirements will be
achieved in a timely way, including State and local planning approvals (programming on the
Transportation Improvement Program or Statewide Transportation Improvement Program);
completion of National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and any other applicable Federal
environmental reviews and approvals, Buy America, and any other applicable State and local
approvals (in most instances, EV charging stations will be eligible for a categorical exclusion
classification under NEPA).

EVgo will work with site host, Cumberland Farms to gain site approvals for the proposed work. Where applicable, CRCOG will assist with coordination with state and local planning organizations and government entities. Site drawings and permit applications and fees will be prepared and delivered to the appropriate entities by EVgo.

• Identification of ownership and operator of the existing facility (including the Temporarily Unavailable ports and underlying ownership of the property).

EVgo owns and operates the electric vehicle charging station located at 471 New Park Ave, West Hartford, CT 06110.

Cumberland Farms is the site host and property owner. EVgo and Cumberland Farms have executed a site host agreement that has been in place since 2/28/2017 and is available upon request.

• Amount of funding requested.

CRCOG is requesting funding in the amount of \$684,800, to include \$620,800 payable to EVgo for the replacement of an electric vehicle charging station and \$64,000 payable to CRCOG for grant administration services.

• Source of matching funds.

EVgo will provide matching funds in the amount of \$155,200 in the form of cash. CRCOG will provide matching funds in the amount of \$16,000 in the form of cash.

• Risk and project readiness information (see Section E of the Notice of Funding Opportunity).

Information within this project narrative and the enclosed pdf containing organizational information are provided to assess risk and project readiness. CRCOG has dedicated staff to serve as a point of contact for this application, and to coordinate activities with project partners, as needed to deliver the project in accordance with FHWA's expectations.

c. Funding Description

EVgo will remove and replace the existing 50kW electric vehicle charger located at 471 New Park Ave, West Hartford, CT 06110 with U.S. manufactured Delta Electronics 350kW HP dual port chargers. This will result in four charging ports capable of simultaneously charging four vehicles at 175kW each. CRCOG will provide grant administration services. The charging station project cost is estimated at \$856,000 including a funding request of \$684,800. Matching funds of \$155,200 will be provided by EVgo in the form of cash. CRCOG will provide matching funds of \$16,000 in the form of cash.

EVgo will complete this project within the 12-month grant agreement.
