STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Governance and Communication GOAL: Create a forum for substantive policy discussions related to key issues, challenges, and opportunities facing our members and the region.

ACTION

 STEP Schedule periodic in-person Policy Board meetings to discuss a substantive policy topic, such as housing, workforce development, or Complete Streets

STATUS

RP&D staff conducted a hybrid meeting on 05/22/24 to discuss the draft Regional POCD. Attendance was light but the conversation was productive.

- Schedule substantive policy discussions with CRCOG's Legislative Committee at key points throughout the legislative session to track and respond to relevant legislation.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Governance and Communication GOAL: Refine CRCOG's communications strategy to promote awareness of CRCOG's work and services, build our professional network, and elevate issues of critical regional importance to the attention of elected officials, municipal staff, and other key stakeholders.

ACTION STEP

Continue CRCOG staff visitation program with member municipalities.

STATUS

We have met with the communities of Andover, Bloomfield, Bolton, Columbia, Coventry, East Granby, East Hartford, Enfield, Farmington, Granby, Hebron, Mansfield, New Britain, Newington, Simsbury, South Windsor, West Hartford, Wethersfield, Willington, and Windsor. It is helpful to have shared conversation between various disciplines (planning, transportation, economic development) and understand local challenges shared by various towns and identify potential opportunities where CRCOG assistance could be helpful.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Federal Infrastructure Funding

GOAL: Assist our members with leveraging maximum funding from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), and related infrastructure grant programs.

ACTION STEP

Continue to assist CRCOG members with preparing competitive applications for funding under the BIL and screen local infrastructure projects for potential funding sources.

STATUS

BIL Coordinator has worked with eighteen municipalities, reviewing priority projects and seeking potential funding sources. CRCOG Municipalities have been awarded 21 discretionary grants, set to bring over \$56M in Federal funding to the region. View CRCOG's Interactive online map of discretionary grants.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Federal Infrastructure Funding GOAL: Assist our members with leveraging maximum funding from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), and related infrastructure grant programs.

ACTION

STEP Build relationships with funding agencies and host workshops and seminars to feature best practices and new technologies.

STATUS

BIL Coordinator has established a good working relationship with federal and state officials, including USDOT and CT BILT. She has coordinated workshops on EV and stormwater infrastructure and is planning sessions on micromobility and transit-oriented development (in collaboration with CT Mainstreet).

ACTION STEP Add services to assist members with the application process, such as a grant newsletter and resources to conduct a benefit-cost analysis (BCA).

STATUS BIL Coordinator began publishing a monthly grant newsletter in August 2023. Staff also conducted a procurement to develop a list of consultants with expertise to conduct a BCA.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Federal Infrastructure Funding

GOAL: Assist our members with leveraging maximum funding from Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL), Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), and related infrastructure grant programs.

COG collaborated with CTDOT and the wns of Berlin, Newington, and Wethersfield submit a RAISE grant application to USDOT eking funds to conduct a Transportation udy of the Berlin Turnpike to improve road fety and connectivity. The project cost is timated at \$2-\$2.5 million, with a \$400,000 \$500,000 (20%) non-Federal cost share cal match). CTDOT has agreed to cover 50% the local match.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Economic Vitality

GOAL: Implement key recommendations in the CEDS (Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy).

ACTION

STEP Add resources to coordinate implementation of the CEDS and promote equity.

STATUS

CRCOG has recent hired Kim Bishop as CRCOG's first Economic Development Coordinator (EDC). Kim will focus on providing staff support for our Economic Development District and coordinating the implementation of our regional Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).

ACTION STEP Continue to develop CRCOG's **Brownfields Remediation Program.**

STATUS

DECD awarded CRCOG an assessment grant for Moxi on the Rocks in East Hartford and for 169 Bartholomew Avenue in Hartford. EPA awarded CRCOG \$1M in supplemental funding for the Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Economic Vitality

GOAL: Implement key recommendations in the CEDS (Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy).

ACTION

STEP Establish an implementation committee and core CRCOG team that meets regularly to pursue priority CEDS goals as well as identify and apply for funding or other opportunities that enable implementation of the CEDS.

STATUS

Staff will shortly begin recruiting key members of CEDS oversight committee, with a goal of convening its first meeting by 09/30/2024. CRCOG, Capitol Workforce Partners, and the MetroHartford Alliance will serve as convenors.

Build and support a network of local government economic development professionals and other regional stakeholders, including arts and cultural institutions.

STATUS

ACTION

STEP

CRCOG's EDC will begin this outreach this summer, in conjunction with our work to establish a CEDS oversight committee.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Regional Housing Strategy

GOAL: Assist member municipalities across the region with increasing access to quality housing for people of varying income levels.

ACTION STEP

Develop a comprehensive housing strategy for our region in partnership with housing-based organizations and other stakeholders.

STATUS

Staff is currently preparing a Request for Proposals (RFP) and anticipates releasing it mid-summer. The goal is to have a consulting team onboard by end of September.

ACTION STEP

Develop a housing toolkit, including model regulations and policies, based on recommendations outlined in the strategy. STATUS CRCOG's regional housing strategy will include toolkit(s), model regulations, and policies for member municipalities and CRCOG to utilize.

ACTION STEP

Seek support and funding to implement strategy recommendations and related initiatives.

STATUS

CRCOG's housing strategy will include proposed funding options to implement the strategy's recommendations.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Regional Housing Strategy

GOAL: Assist member municipalities across the region with increasing access to quality housing for people of varying income levels.

ACTION

STEP Implement the HUD-funded grant assistance program for Low to Moderate Income (LMI) homeowners with crumbling foundations.

STATUS

Staff successfully implemented this program in spring 2024. We have reviewed 43 applications and made 7 awards.

ACTION STEP Increase housing supply by continuing to implement CRCOG's **Brownfields Remediation Program**, prioritizing brownfields redevelopment within transitoriented corridors. STATUS CRCOG issued a commitment letter for the Arrowhead Gateway Development Loan from CRCOG's MetroHartford Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund. Loan underwriting and final loan agreement is in progress.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Regional Environmental Services

GOAL: Implement key recommendations in CRCOG's waste management study to develop a more sustainable waste management system for the region.

GOAL: Develop a long-term plan to significantly improve stormwater infrastructure across the region, implementing nature-based solutions where appropriate.

ACTION ACTION STEP Re-establish the Central CT Solid Waste STEP Authority (CCSWA) to help implement the recommendations outlined in CRCOG's recent waste management study. STATUS STATUS CRCOG re-convened CCSWA in Sep 2023. CCSWA has updated its bylaws and ordinance to streamline its operations and is presently working on an organics diversion project that will be open to all CRCOG members. CCSWA will also conduct a membership campaign in the coming months.

Conduct a grant-funded stormwater management study to analyze the condition of existing infrastructure and to identify needed improvements and regional solutions, including the potential for stormwater authorities and utilities.

Staff worked with CT Department of Energy & Environmental Protection (DEEP) to finalize scope of work and budget for CRF grant. DEEP is preparing the final contract and anticipates a 2 to 4-month time-frame before a contract is executed. CRCOG expects to issue a Request for Qualifications later this fall.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Regional Environmental Services GOAL: Work to meet goals set by state and federal governments to address climate change.

GOAL: Work to dramatically improve safety for all road users in an equitable way and to promote micromobility and Complete Streets.

ACTION STEP

Incorporate a Vision Zero approach into the Regional Transportation Safety Plan update.

STATUS

CRCOG has appointed a 15-member Vision Zero task force to assist with the RTSP update. The task force identified preliminary safety goals at its 06/18/2024 meeting.

ACTION STEP Complete the Roundabout Screening Study, the East Coast Greenway Gap Closure Study, and various corridor studies.

STATUS

Anticipated completion dates are as follows: • Roundabout Screening Study – July 2024 • Farmington Connectivity Study– July 2024 • East Coast Greenway Study – September 2024 • Route 20 Study, Windsor Locks - Complete • Route 44 Study, Canton – December 2024

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Coordinated Approach to Road Safety, Complete Streets, and Multi-use Trail Projects

GOAL: Work to dramatically improve safety for all road users in an equitable way and to promote micromobility and Complete Streets.

ACTION

STEP Take on new initiatives such as the **Regional Bicycle/Pedestrian Priority** Network Plan, offering bike/ped count and walk audit as additional services.

STATUS

CRCOG released an RFQ for the Regional Bike and Pedestrian Priority Network Plan and is working with the top-rated consultant to finalize scope and fee proposals.

Staff has conducted two walk audits with the towns of Andover and Canton and has an additional audit planned with the Town of Vernon in July.

ACTION STEP Continue to help member municipalities seek funds for **Complete Streets and related** implementation projects. STATUS Provide administrative support to CTDOT for their Active Transportation Micro Grant for CRCOG municipalities. We have advertised, disbursed funds, and collected applications from nearly 10 communities totaling over \$56,000.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Enhanced Bus and Rail Service. GOAL: Collaborate with CTDOT, member municipalities, the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission (PVPC), and other stakeholders to improve passenger service on the Hartford Line.

GOAL: Help shape the GHMS and advocate for the implementation of recommended projects.

ACTION

STEP Re-establish the Central CT Solid Waste Authority (CCSWA) to help implement the recommendations outlined in CRCOG's recent waste management study.

STATUS

CRCOG re-convened CCSWA in Sep 2023. CCSWA has updated its bylaws and ordinance to streamline its operations and is presently working on an organics diversion project that will be open to all CRCOG members. CCSWA will also conduct a membership campaign in the coming months.

ACTION STEP Continue to participate in the development and implementation of the GHMS.

STATUS CRCOG's Transportation Planning staff has carefully reviewed the Planning & Environmental Linkages Study (PEL) for the project and continues to meet regularly with the CTDOT project team. At staff's recommendation, CRCOG's Transportation Committee has endorsed the PEL. The Policy Board will review the PEL at its 06/26/2024meeting.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Public Sector Workforce Development, Shared Services, and Direct Services

GOAL: Work with member municipalities and other key stakeholders to develop a talent pipeline for key municipal occupations.

GOAL: Help member municipalities share services to capture economies of scale and improve service quality.

STRATEGIC PRIORITY: Public Sector Workforce Development, Shared Services, and Direct Services

GOAL: Provide direct services through CRCOG where desired and feasible.

ACTION STEP

Refine and build out CRCOG's GIS & Data Center to serve our members and CRCOG staff.

STATUS

CRCOG's Regional Data Portal in addition to the regional parcel viewer, now provides multiple dashboards, StoryMaps, a data download page and study results.

ACTION STEP

In collaboration with State agencies and other key stakeholders, assess workforce recruitment and retention within the region's public safety services, with initial focus on EMS systems, and develop an action plan to implement desired improvements.

STATUS

Future project in collaboration with Municipal Services Committee (MSC) and Capitol **Region Emergency Planning** Committee (CREPC).

ACTION STEP

Develop a municipal resource library with toolkits, model regulations and policies, best practices, and other information to serve member municipalities.

STATUS

Ongoing. Staff most recently added a toolkit for Automated Traffic Enforcement Safety Devices (ATESD).
